- Ensuring high-quality provision and services in the FE and Training sector.




Who is This Programme for?

This programme is aimed at sector leaders responsible for driving strategic change in organisations. Participants may come from various backgrounds, including curriculum, quality, finance, employer engagement, business development, and marketing. Typically, participants would be expected to be working at a senior leadership level in a role with cross-organisational responsibility for change, improvement and development. The title you hold is not important; what is important is that you are in a leadership position that requires you to implement and drive strategies that enable organisational improvement and success.

The programme is open to colleagues from ESFA-funded colleges, independent training providers, sixth-form colleges and local authority providers.

As well as taking part in the core programme elements which include residentials and online sessions, participants will need to be able to commit to completing a work-related project and working through online learning materials.



Programme Structure

In order to provide participants with the maximum impact, this programme has been designed to blend a range of learning approaches.

Programme Launch

Each cohort will be introduced to the programme via an in-person workshop where delegates will get the opportunity to network.

Online Seminars and Workshops

Throughout the programme, delegates will take part in three online workshops led by expert witnesses.

Programme Residentials

Throughout the programme, the cohort will come together in two-day residentials. Our programme residentials provide opportunities for delegates to network with colleagues, participate in facilitated sessions and challenging workshops, and develop solutions for the future.

Expert Witnesses

Throughout the programme, we will invite a number of expert witnesses to give delegates new insights, tools and techniques to apply in their leadership.

Work-Related Project

Early into the programme, delegates will identify a critical organisational opportunity or challenge and undertake an action-learning project that results in solutions and ideas for change and improvement. Delegates will also receive individual project coaching to ensure a successful outcome.

£725 per delegate. This includes one night's dinner, bed and breakfast at each programme residential.

- Disabled people and those from black and minority ethnic communities, both of whom are currently underrepresented on ETF courses.
